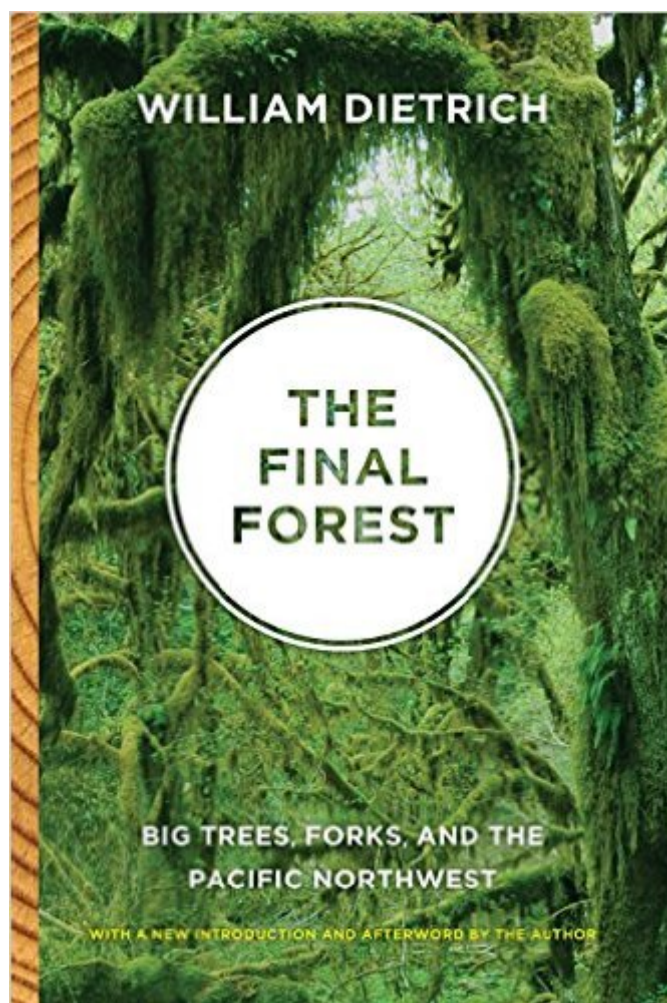

Before Forks, a small town on Washington's Olympic Peninsula, became famous as the location for Stephenie Meyer's Twilight book series, it was the self-proclaimed "Logging Capital of the World" and ground zero in a regional conflict over the fate of old-growth forests. Since Pulitzer Prize-winning journalist William Dietrich first published *The Final Forest* in 1992, logging in Forks has given way to tourism, but even with its new fame, Forks is still a home to loggers and others who make their living from the surrounding forests. The new edition recounts how forest policy and practices have changed since the early 1990s and also tells us what has happened in Forks and where the actors who were so important to the timber wars are now. Growing up in an era where I heard of the spotted owl and the surrounding controversy as told by the loggers in my family, this book was a wonderfully impartial recount of the facts of the case. The back stories of all sides of the issue were very helpful in being able to more completely understand why each person formed the opinions that they did. With the mainstream media focusing only on the controversial aspect of any issue, it was refreshing to be able to read and form my own opinions on the subject.

This updated version of the Final Forest is a fascinating history of the "Spotted Owl" controversy concerning logging in the West End of the Olympic Peninsula of Washington State. Dietrich writing is obviously brilliant .. but it's also an even-handed and accurate work of journalism. He patiently explains the wildly divergent views of many actors involved .. from wood cutters, truck drivers, mill owners, Warehouse executives, forestry academics, wildlife biologists, environmental activists, Forrest Service employees, WA Dept. Natural Resources employees, and the good people of Forks WA. The book is so well researched and so well written .. it's hard to put down.
