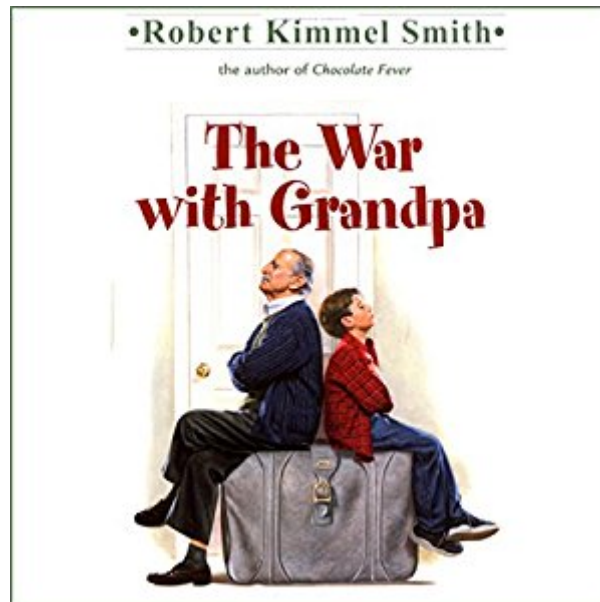

Kids love practical jokes. And they love the idea of playing practical jokes on adults even more, particularly when the adult in question is temporarily brought down to the same level as the kid. This was a favorite book of mine when it was first published because it perfectly brings those common child fantasies to life in a realistic manner. Pete is angry when he learns that his grandfather will be coming to live with him and will be taking over Pete's bedroom. After giving his grandfather an ultimatum, Pete declares war on his grandfather, and in this case war takes the form of an escalating series of pranks. Grandpa sees the war as an amusing diversion, and he responds in kind. But by the end of the book, both combatants find themselves trapped in a situation that they would rather avoid. This book artfully captures the dynamics of family relationships. Pete and his grandfather love each other, and yet their love is confused by the fights that they have.

Kimmel-Smith does a great job of depicting the conflicted emotions that children feel for their family members. I highly recommend this book to any young reader. It is a very entertaining read, and will be a pleasant way to pass an evening or two.

I have read this book aloud to my 5th graders for a few years now. The story line is a great one for kids - showing that families can struggle with various issues and sometimes unsure of how to solve the problem. There is a lot of humor in this story as the grandson tries to go to war with Grandpa to get his room back. The book is filled with figurative language, such as similes, metaphors, and hyperboles. Very enjoyable read aloud!
